

A complete transport network

Strategically positioned between 2 of France's largest airports (Nice-Côte d'Azur and Marseille-Provence) and home to two international airports including Toulon-Hyères, the Var is served by Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur's 3 largest airports and runs direct flights to around 200 national and international destinations. The Var also offers leading edge, international-level infrastructures for business aviation.

Its railway network and 4 TGV (high-speed train railway stations) - Toulon, Les Arcs-sur-Argens, Saint-Raphaël and Hyères – offer fast and easy access to France's main cities and beyond. 8 TGV trains run daily between Paris and Toulon in under 4 hours and the Lyon-Toulon trip takes just 2 ½ hours.

The Var's endless Mediterranean shores make it a magnificent stop-off for cruise passengers: it is home to no less than 12 cruise ports welcoming 230 cruise calls and around 330,000 passengers in 2017.

The "Cruise Friendly" Label – a winning initiative

Created by the Var Provence Cruise Club, the "Cruise Friendly" label was rewarded at the Seatrade Cruise Europe fair in Hamburg in September 2017, when the VPCC was nominated as a finalist (out of 100 candidates) in the new "Marketing Initiative of the Year" category of the Seatrade Cruise Awards, alongside the prestigious cruise line Holland America Lines.

The label's objective: to win cruise passenger loyalty, offer surprising experiences, prompt a desire to return and leave passengers with unforgettable memories of their stay in the Var.

326 of the Var's retailers and tourism professionals have been awarded the "Cruise Friendly" label: 137 in Toulon and La Seyne, 76 in Bandol, 22 in Saint-Raphaël, 40 in Sanary and 51 in Hyères. Other towns will be joining the "Cruise Friendly" initiative next year: St-Tropez, Le Castellet, Bormes-les-Mimosas and Le Lavandou.

The Garden of the Med, where Provence and the Côte d'Azur join hands, the Var overflows with passion, authenticity, history and modernity. Natural and urban landscapes live side by side here in total harmony. It embodies both the inland beauty of Provence and legendary azure waters of the Mediterranean Sea, as sought after today as they were in the early 20th century.

As such, Var Tourisme is a financer of the "Contrat de Destination Provence" agreement and partner to the "Côte d'Azur France" trademark.

"Contrat de Destination Provence"

Provence is one of the 20 French destinations selected by the French State in 2015 to benefit from a "Contrat de Destination". The "Contrat Destination Provence" is led by the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Council and Bouches-du-Rhône Tourisme.



It is co-financed by the Vaucluse, Var and Alpes de Haute Provence areas, together with the Provence's main tourist offices (Toulon-Provence, Saint-Tropez, Provence Verte, etc. in the Var). Var Tourisme is part of the "Contrat Destination Provence" steering committee and takes part in its various working groups.

June 7th-10th, 2018: Harley-Davidson Eurofestival

June 24th, 2018 will mark the return of the Formula 1 Grand Prix to Le Castellet! Fully refurbished for the occasion, the Paul Ricard race track inaugurated in 1970 will be proudly welcoming this prestigious event once again next year. Set to attract over 66,000 spectators, the event's economic spinoffs for the region are estimated at 65 million euro.

The Paul Ricard race track is famed worldwide and its location benefits from a large tourist capacity.

Over 66,000 spectators are expected for the 2018 event, including one-third overseas visitors. The average length of stay is estimated at 4 days, i.e. over 250,000 overnight stays, plus the Grand Prix teams themselves, i.e. 3,000 people staying for an average of 5 days.

Spectator and staff expenditure is estimated at 36 million euro, excluding tickets, with organisational costs estimated at 6 million euro. Total short-term economic spinoffs for the region are estimated at 65 million euro.

Overseas spectators represent the highest potential value creation for the region and will also have a direct impact on business for Marseille-Provence and Toulon-Hyères airports (freight and passenger traffic) and Le Castellet and La Môle-Saint-Tropez airfields, welcoming VIP passengers.

Var Tourisme's President Françoise Dumont is delighted to see the Grand Prix returning to the Paul Ricard race track; the event's international reach is truly excellent news for the local economy, employment and tourism.

Home to such majestic backdrops as the Verdon Canyon and Artuby river, the Sainte-Baume, Estérel and Maures hills that fold and unfold to form ever-changing decor, Argens river quenching the thirsty soil from West to East and shores harbouring countless treasures, the Var offers holidaymakers an infinite variety of experiences and emotions, inviting them to revel in the joys of nature in every season and write their own exciting script, filled with magic and adventure.

BREATHE

The Var's natural treasures are a limitless source of wellbeing. Simply open your eyes, take in the scenery and experience the joy of simply being present

Whether you're at the summit of Mont Lachens, in the heart of chestnut forests and cork oaks in the Maures hills, lapping up the views over the Bay of Toulon from Mont Faron, roaming the hillsides, gardens or vines, with your feet in the water or nose to the wind, nature is everywhere here, in every shape, form and perfume, its colours glorified by the Mediterranean sunshine.

THE HERMANN TORTOISE IS MOVING!

The Maures plain offers a particularly nurturing environment for the endangered Hermann tortoise and has been home to the "Village des Tortues" (Tortoise Village) in Gonfaron since 1988. This educational centre, dedicated to preserving the species, was moved to Carnoules in June 2017 and now features an outdoor itinerary, 400 m² greenhouse, exhibition room, museum, aquatic area and guided tours, offering visitors a fascinating introducing to this endemic species found in the Maures hills.

Hill chains

 $The Var's \verb|3main| hill chains all have very different characteristics.$

To the West of the Var, at an altitude of over 1,000 metres, lie the rocky ridges of the Sainte-Baume hills, covered with an ancient forest that lends it a totally unique and priceless botanical value. Bathed in a very spiritual aura since Saint

Mary Magdalene's legendary retreat in a grotto and said to have been protected by gods and kings from time immemorial, this astonishing heritage site and cathedral of plant life now shelters under the wing of the local authorities and various environmental initiatives, prompting the recent creation of France's 52nd Regional Nature Reserve.

ACCESS TO THE VAR'S HILL RANGES

A public awareness and information tool designed to reduce the risk of forest fires, the A.L.A.R.M.E. plan provides real time information on forest access according to weather conditions.

The Prefecture publishes an updated map every day before 7 p.m. for the following day, stipulating the danger level for each hill range and restrictions to forest access, traffic and parking when necessary.

Further to the East, the Maures hills span almost one quarter of the Var, from the highest ridge rising 780 metres over the inland countryside to the curvy edge winding its way around the coast. The history of mankind has forged the shape of these hills, with their hot, sunny face laden with cork oaks and cooler, moist slopes where sweet chestnuts abound. Home to 26 villages, silent forests and offering truly breathtaking views, the Maures hills are a genuine treasure trove for those who venture there.

Separated from its neighbour by the Argens river, the Estérel hill chain rises to an altitude of 618 metres. Alternating ragged peaks, ravines and rocky outcrops, its flaming red porphyry rocks sprawl all the way down to the sea. Maritime pines still grow here, but arid

scrubland prevails. These wild and striking stony landscapes form the visual identity of the Var's eastern section.

Other landmarks forming the Var's characteristic relief include the curious "Rocher de Roquebrune" – a rock formed out of lacy red sandstone –, the Tanneron hills and their slopes laden with mimosa and so-called "Monts Toulonnais" (Mounts of Toulon) including Mont Faron, offering stunning views over the Bay of Toulon.

Last but not least, don't miss the Var's highest lookout post during your stay! Set to the North-East, Mont Lachens rises to an altitude of 1,715 metres and boasts unbeatable views over 5 French departments, from the Southern Alps to the Med.

From the long beach of Les Lecques in Saint-Cyr-sur-Mer to Cape Roux plunging down onto the Estérel's Corniche d'Or coast road, the Var's coastline overflows with treasures! Its 400 kilometres of beautiful shores alternate fjords nestling among pine trees, wild coves and beaches of white sand or pebbles, rubbing shoulders with steep slopes, peaks, cliffs and ledges. From breathtaking landscapes to protected areas, marinas, seaside resorts, ports, little fishing harbours, coastal footpaths and sightseeing routes, the Var has something for every sailor-at-heart, nature lover, marine life aficionado, sports fan and curiosity-seeker.

Islands

The Var's Mediterranean seascapes are dotted with glorious islands where you can take a dip in an idyllic, picture postcard decor... Our golden sands, translucent turquoise waters, waterside pine woods and magnificent sea beds are absolute musts!

Porquerolles: this paradise measures 7 km in length and 3 km in width! After a few hours lazing on the beach lined with pine woods, opt for a tour on foot or by bike to lap up the sheer beauty of this little island.

Port-Cros: more mountainous than Porquerolles and covered with Aleppo pines and evergreen oaks, this island – the smallest in the archipelago – is also definitely the wildest, home to exceptional marine life protected by a land and sea National Park.

Le Levant: this island lies to the East of the archipelago and is famed for its 80-hectare naturist site.

Presqu'île de Giens: the ancient island of Giens is joined to the mainland by two long arms of sand – a double isthmus – home to the highly-coveted Almanarre and La Capte beaches. The former saltmarshes, located between the two arms, are now a bird reserve.

Further West you will come to the Embiez and Ile de Bendor archipelago, now managed by the Paul Ricard foundation.

Preserved areas

Plaine des Maures National Nature Reserve

Over 5,000 hectares of the Maures Plain were declared a Nature Reserve in 2009. Unique in France, this area harbours an exceptional biodiversity and wide variety of natural habitats sheltering both heritage and threatened species.

Port-Cros National Park

Created over 50 years ago (1963), Port-Cros National Park administrates the Porquerolles National Mediterranean Conservatory and is Europe's oldest Marine Protected Area. A combined land and sea-based park spanning Port-Cros and Porquerolles, it covers 1,700 hectares of land and 2,900 of sea.

The small isles of Bagaud and La Gabinière are classified as nature reserves and are part of the "Pelagos Sanctuary", created to protect the Mediterranean's marine mammals.

The Park also harbours a fascinating historic heritage and the remains of 5 forts stand witness to its former defensive role.

Verdon Regional Nature Reserve

Spanning the Var and Alpes de Haute-Provence areas, the Verdon Regional Nature Reserve is home to 46 towns and villages. Its identity is forged around the impressive Verdon Canyon, forming a natural frontier between the two French Departments. A major tourist attraction, the park is committed to preserving and embellishing its natural, built and human heritage in the framework of a sustainable and responsible tourism policy. France's "Grand Canyon" – a giant rocky chasm up to 700 metres in depth where green waters flow – is a spectacular site, unique in France. The lower area of the canyon, home to the tranquil lakes of Esparron, Artignosc and Montmeyan and vast, turquoise lake of Sainte-Croix, are also musts while you are visiting this part of the Var. A bridge between the scenery of the Alps and Mediterranean, it is home to a wealth of flora and fauna and heralds the landscapes of Pays de l'Artuby, deeply marked by the culture of the Southern Alps.

Set on a ledge over the sea, this domain, managed by the "Conservatoire du Littoral" (French Coastal Conservancy), owes its unique character to gardener and botanist Gilles Clément - the creator of this astonishing voyage through the Mediterranean climates of the world - and promises an extraordinary sensory experience in every season. "Les Jardins de la Commanderie de Peyrassol", a magnificent vineyard in Flassans-sur-Issole, were recently awarded the "Remarkable Gardens" label (2017) for their unique open-air itinerary comprising a botanical exhibition and contemporary art collection, throwing bridges between nature and art. The town of Hyères also boasts an exceptional natural heritage and is home to three delightful municipal parks. Don't miss the "Jardin de la Cascade" in Villecroze; a stunning waterfall gushing out of the cliff face over the famous Troglodyte caves lying below, or "Domaine d'Orves" park in La Valette. This tour of the Var's fragrant floral heritage wouldn't be complete without evoking the village of Figanières and its astonishing collection of over 300 aromatic plants, or the "Jardin de Baudouvin", paying tribute to Provence's ancient gardening traditions.

Offering different but equally gorgeous landscapes in every season, our vast network of footpaths criss-cross their way from the hinterland to the coast and are a guaranteed way to get back on top of the world!

Whether you fancy a quiet stroll, sporty hike or family walk, just pick your pace and path! The Var is home to a truly endless choice of signposted itineraries, including 800 km of official long-distance footpaths and several hundred kilometres of shorter routes! This "walker's web" also includes a little-known but superb 138-km section of the Way of Saint James

stretching from Rome to Compostela in Spain, also part of the "Mediterranean Arc" running along the sea from Italy to Morocco.

The gorgeous Coastal Footpath (Sentier du Littoral), formerly used by Customs Officers to look out for smugglers, alternates sporty sections and beach breaks. 

Many artists, scientists and patrons have crossed paths here over the centuries. A land of hospitality and shelter, the Var pays homage to the talented men and women at the origin of our buzzing cultural life.

Countless famous figures have lived in and loved the Var: the German intellectuals that took shelter in Sanary with Thomas Mann, Var-born poet Jean Aicard, author of the romantic adventures of Maurin des Maures, who now has his own museum in La Garde, Gérard Philipe, whose grave can be visited in Ramatuelle, Jean Cocteau who stayed in Toulon, Aldous Huxley, who wrote Brave New World at La Gorguette in Sanary and the living legends of today in Saint-Tropez the list is simply too long to write!

Portraits

Paul Ricard

Paul Ricard was fired with a passion for creation. This master businessman founded a company with a very avant-garde social policy, invented global communication and hoisted the drink named after him to world leader.

A visionary and humanist, he invented the notion of corporate patronage. He created exhibition spaces to promote young artists, while his love of nature and the sea led him collaborate with Alain Bombard and sponsor Alain Colas and Éric Tabarly.

Three of his firms set up ambitious projects in the Var, contributing to the destination's attractiveness: new facilities on lle de Bendor island in Bandol, the port and oceanographic institute on lle des Embiez and the prestigious race track located in Le Castellet, hitting the headlines this year with the return of the French Formula 1 Grand Prix in 2018.

Captain Cousteau

Is it really surprising that the emblematic Jacques-Yves Cousteau elected the Var coast – a scuba diving paradise – as his place of residence? The famous oceanographer spent part of his life at his villa "Le Baobab" in Sanary, now the home of his son Jean-Michel Cousteau. In 1942, the world-famed Captain shot the first underwater film (18 minutes at a depth of 18 metres!) on Ile des Embiez, with his friends P. Taillez and F. Dumas, fondly known as the "Les Mousquemers". The work of this impassioned trio can be admired today at the Frédéric Dumas museum.

Max Ernst

The creator of the strange bird "Loplop" finally came to rest on planet Seillans in the Var area.

With over 100 lithographs, etchings and engravings by Max Ernst and Dorothea Tanning, this collection retraces the life of the couple in Seillans from 1964 to 1976. Acclaimed as one of the greatest representatives of the Surrealist movement, Max Ernst finished his life and work in the quiet setting of this pretty hilltop village. You can admire his famous bronze statue "Le Génie de la Bastille" on Place de la République - the village square so dear to him.

Allied Landings

The collective memory of the 20th century's most painful events continues to live on, all the way down to the deepest depths of the sea. The scuttling of the French fleet on November 27th, 1942 and Allied Landings of August 15th, 1944 on the beaches set below the Maures hills and in Saint Raphaël, are unforgettable chapters in the history of WWII.

Now celebrated for their sea and sun, the beaches of Le Lavandou, Rayol-Canadel, Cavalaire, Ramatuelle, Sainte-Maxime and Saint-Raphaël still echo to the sound of American infantrymen and tanks, shouldered by the Var's fervent Resistants.

An absolute must for every history lover keen to understand this little-known event, the "Mémorial du Débarquement et de la Libération de Provence" allied landings museum in Toulon, inaugurated in 1964 by General de Gaulle, has just been fully refurbished.

The Var's heritage dates back many centuries! From the days of Ancient Greece to the contemporary era, testimonials to Europe's great architectural, societal and religious movements are everywhere to be seen here!

Sites and Monuments

Chateaux & Forts

The Var is home to a host of must-see sites still standing witness to the civilian architecture and defence systems erected here since the Middle Ages, including many forts and chateaux dating from various eras and harbouring a rich and tempestuous history...

Standing over Vallée de la Bresque, Château d'Entrecasteaux is bathed in a unique atmosphere; its elegant box tree beds stand out amid the spontaneous beauty of the surrounding landscapes. Also situated in the Provence Verte area, Château de la Verdière was largely-redesigned in the 18th century and is now one of Provence's most beautiful stately homes.

In addition to the many forts set around the Bay of Toulon or on the Iles d'Or islands off the coast of Hyères, don't miss a visit to Brégançon Fort on the coast of Bormes-les-Mimosas; in addition to its strategic location, this fort is now the official residence of the French President.

Religious heritage

The Var's religious medieval architecture includes several Romanesque masterpieces, such as Thoronet Abbey: a jewel of Cistercian art with its sober, powerful silhouette, the Episcopal buildings in Fréjus and La Celle Abbey, now home to an arts centre. The Basilica in Saint-Maximin – Provence's largest Gothic construction – and Chartreuse de la Verne are absolute musts too.

Religious sanctuaries in Provence Verte

The Provence Verte area is home to three places of pilgrimage bearing the "Sanctuaires en France" label:

Sainte Marie-Madeleine Basilica in Saint Maximin, Notre-Dame de Grâces Sanctuary in Cotignac and Saint Mary Magdalene's Grotto in Plan d'Aups.

Provence Verte is a member of the "Villes Sanctuaires en France" association, committed to bringing together French tourism and religious sanctuary representatives. The association was also at the origin of ATOUT FRANCE's "Tourism & Spirituality" working group, which aims to promote its members worldwide.

The originality of these beautiful sites lies in their magnificently

varied vistas, ancient chapels, churches, châteaux, food markets and many unusual little museums, such as the mechanical data processing museum in Bargemon.

Popular Heritage

The identity of the local landscapes is also marked by their rural heritage, in particular the area's famous "restanques". These traditional dry stone walls, the fruit of monumental work by farmers to develop crops grown on terraces, adorn and carve out the local relief from the coast to the hinterland.

The exceptional concentration of 21 ice wells in the Sainte-Baume hills – another unique specificity of the Var – stands witness to a major industry that survived until the late 19th century.

Museums and exhibitions

From academic hubs to contemporary, interactive layouts, the Var's museums offer an eclectic choice of excursions catering to every interest and include novel tours, biographical collections, heritage sites and historic frescoes... A multitude of fun and captivating ways to explore the pathways of science and art.

Saint-Tropez alone is home to 4 museums, including the Maritime History Museum set inside the Citadel overlooking the port: one of the Var's foremost tourist attractions welcoming over 100,000 visitors every year! A success owed to the gripping story of the life of sailors and the glorious past of this Mediterranean port. Don't miss the town's "Musée de la Gendarmerie et du Cinéma de Saint-Tropez": a nod to Louis de Funès' hilarious film saga and a fitting introduction to the

birth of cinema and its movie stars in Saint-Tropez. "Musée de l'Annonciade" on the port showcases a superb collection of Fauvism, Nabi and Pointillist works conjuring up memories of Paul Signac's stay in the town with his artist friends and offering a fine tribute to Provence's envied quality of light. Also on the colour theme, the "Maison des Papillons" butterfly museum is another original and surprising feature of the town.

"Musée National de la Marine" (National Naval Museum) in Toulon. A living tribute to the town's naval base, this museum retraces the history of the French Navy and Toulon's military port - the Mediterranean's largest! The museum also hosts a range of enriching cultural activities on the naval theme.

"Musée des Gueules Rouges" in Tourves

For many years, the Var occupied poll position in the aluminium industry thanks to its vast bauxite deposits. The extraction of this mineral, coveted in the last century for its alumina content, covered the faces of the miners with red dust. Nicknamed the "Red Faces", the miners became the symbol of a moving story that forged both human lives and the natural landscapes. The museum offers a precious tribute to this era, together with a fascinating insight into its geological, technical and scientific facets.

"Musée Terra Rossa" in Salernes

This architectural ceramics museum in Salernes pays tribute to a town famed for its magnificent traditional earthenware and in particular the area's beautiful "tomette" hexagonal red floor tiles

Spanning over 3,000 m², this magnificent museum was designed by acclaimed contemporary architect and designer Jean Michel Wilmotte inside an ancient tile factory. Terra Rossa features a variety of permanent exhibitions: archaeology, including Europe's oldest ceramics dating back 7,000 years and an exceptional collection entitled "Le Monde Carré" (Square World) brought together by Benoît Faÿ, with over 2,000 decorated tiles manufactured between the Middle Ages and 20th century. Two showrooms present current creations by local factories and potters, showcasing the creative potential of this time-honoured material.

Musée des Troupes de Marines in Fréjus

History, Science & Technology, military art and traditions and human adventures The collections, archives and iconographic documents on show at the Naval Troops Museum illustrate the captivating history of France's colonial and naval troops, from the Richelieu era to current day.

Travel the Var to the sound of music

Every year, the Var vibrates to the uplifting sounds of Jazz, for the greatest pleasure of aficionados from the world over. From Brignoles to Porquerolles and the Verdon to Ramatuelle, from the greatest classics to high-flying impros, a flurry of festivals vie for top place on the talent podium, while impassioned musicians cross paths in La Seyne-sur-Mer all the way into November at the Fort Napoléon Jazz Club.

Enthusiastic audiences get together every year to celebrate an out-of-the-ordinary musical holiday in style, with events such as the "Joutes Musicales de Correns" - a festival upheld for over 20 years by "Le Chantier" Music Creation Centre in the Provence Verte area – inviting visitors to discover a host of talents from around the globe.

Taking place in 2018, the 28th "Rencontres Internationales du Thoronet" is a world-renowned medieval music festival welcoming ever-bigger audiences every year: the programme has now spread its wings and features concert venues throughout the Var.

A movie hub

The Var welcomes film directors and crews from all over globe and its locations are acclaimed worldwide – our natural scenery offers a magnificent open-air backdrop for film shoots.

Founded over 25 years ago, the Var Film Commission facilitates the work of producers and film crews and promotes the Var to both the national and international film and audiovisual industry.

Inspired by the United States, where film commissions are widespread, the Var Film Commission was formed in 1991 to respond to producers' special needs and simplify the moviemaking process. It was the first of its kind in France.

NEW IN 2018

Château de la Verdière

After a series of refurbishment campaigns since 2003, Château de la Verdière is now a model of conservation, spanning 5,000 m² of buildings, with no less than 365 doors and windows! The Château's magnificent former interior mouldings have now been restored with infinite finesse and the site will be open to the public from summer 2018.

The New Mont Faron Memorial in Toulon: commemorating the Allied Landings and Liberation of Provence

Entirely renovated in 2016 and re-opened to the public in March 2017, this museum is one of the French Defence Ministry's 9 official memorial sites, featuring the latest historical research combined with cutting-edge technology, allowing visitors to re-live the Allied Landings in Provence and events of Summer 1944. Set at the top of Mont Faron, it is also a great opportunity to lap up breathtaking, panoramic views over the Bay of Toulon. The famous Faron cable-car, inaugurated in 1959, now offers visitors attractive, updated cabins.

Specialities

Provence's dishes are always sprinkled with the characteristic accent of the South. In and around the Var, the local cuisine comes in a myriad of sun-drenched recipes: Provencal stew, grilled fish, Soupe au Pistou, Aïoli, Anchoïade, Ratatouille and Artichoke Barigoule Tradition continues to stand guard over each area's heritage and the Var has its own legacy of delicious specialities!

For example, Toulon's "Cade" is called "Socca" in Nice and "Panisses" in Marseille! This chickpea pancake seasoned with salt and pepper (or sugar) and baked in the oven is still sold at the local markets, just as it was in olden times. Savour it hot as you roam the market stalls in Toulon or Sanary, the atmosphere makes all the difference!

Our "Tarte Tropézienne" is a genuine institution in the food world. And that's no exaggeration! It is the story of an encounter between two delicious creams and a moist sponge in Saint-Tropez in 1955 that gave birth to a unique dessert (now patented), an emblematic, three-storey store with a restaurant and an online sales network... In short, an empire!

MARKET SHOPPING

Provence's cuisine is the natural expression of a land bathed in sunshine and swept by the Mistral wind and sea spray. Forming a bridge between the Mediterranean and Southern Alps, the Var cultivates its own unique culinary character – the fruit of a diverse soil and relief – with a profusion of colourful produce bedecking the local market stalls.

Here's a short list of succulent, must-have ingredients.

Local produce

Figs

This emblematic Mediterranean tree, anchored in the local landscapes and culture of Provence, has set up home in the Var. France's leading producer, the area accounts for over 70% of national fig production. Fig growing is especially predominant in the Vallée du Gapeau to the South-West of the Var thanks to a conducive geology and weather conditions: the town of Solliès-Pont was awarded the "Figue de Solliès" AOC label in 2011 for its delicious "Violette de Solliès" fig, unique in France.

Olive oil

Olive groves are everywhere here on the terraced hillsides or down in the plains and are one of Provence's most endearing symbols. No less than 32 varieties of olive are grown in the Var, some of which, like the "Belgentiéroise" (a long, green olive with firm skin, excellent for cooking), can only be found here! Our infinite variety of flavourful olive oils are produced in 142 towns out of a total of 153!

Three out of the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region's 5 AOC oils are grown in the Var: "Huile d'Olive de Provence", "Huile d'Olive de Haute-Provence" and "Huile d'Olive d'Aix en Provence", in recognition of the Var's high-quality and extremely diverse production.



"Oliveraie départementale" in La Farlède

Home to veteran olive trees, some of which are over 650 years old and feature remarkably broad trunks, this domain is reminiscent of an exhibition of very ancient sculptures Forged by winds and droughts, its trees offer a magnificent testimonial to history.

Olive oil mills and farms

The Var is home to France's largest concentration of olive oil producers and mills, with 41 mills, including 25 cooperative and municipal mills. Although some mills are resolutely modern, others have remained traditional. Some offer guided tours of the mill and olive farm.

Mill tours: the ancient Partégal oil mill in La Farlède, Flayosquet mill in Flayosc, "Moulin de Callas" and its ancient oil mill, now a museum.

Many of our modern mills also offer fascinating guided tours, such as Domaine de Taurenne (including a tour of the olive farm) in Tourtour, the Gervasoni mill in Aups, Moulin du Haut Jasson in La Londe-les-Maures, Le Clos Saint-Martin in Roquebrune-sur-Argens and many more.

Lovers of Provencal history and traditions will enjoy the **Musée des Arts et Traditions Populaires folk museum in Draguignan**, where you can learn all about olive growing and life in the Var in days gone by. The museum also features magnificent old mill equipment.

Honey

Reputed throughout the world, our honeys are the fruit of the Var's unique botany and benefit from the "Miel de Provence" Protected Geographical Indication. They owe their unique aromas to our highly-diverse Mediterranean flora and, especially, the aromatic plants (over 200 varieties) that thrive on Provence's hard and arid soil.

Honey production depends entirely on flowering seasons, with rosemary honey from around the Sainte-Baume hills in early Spring, followed by white heather honey, then chestnut honey from the Maures hills, heralding summer and its river of lavender honey Purple heather honey comes in Autumn, followed by an original little touch at the gateway to winter: arbutus honey produced in the Maures hills.

Sweet chestnuts

The beautiful chestnut groves covering the hillsides of the Maures hills have been intensively farmed since the 19th century; at the time, chestnuts from the Maures were sold throughout France and even exported to Europe! Although this activity no longer sets the pace of life as it did in bygone days, it remains the Var's sole chestnut-producing area and has maintained its prestigious reputation.

Awarded the "Village of Character" label, Collobrières, capital of the Maures hills and unrivalled capital of the chestnut, celebrates its heritage every autumn along with every town and village in the vicinity - Gonfaron, La Garde-Freinet, Les Mayons and Pignans - with the "Fête de la Châtaigne" chestnut fair. Make way for roast chestnuts! But this fruit has more than one trick up its sleeve: candied, coasted, creamed or puréed (to name but a few), it remains one of our most emblematic products.

Truffles

A genuine perfumed diamond, the truffle is a source of endless pleasure and enchantment. Its very special woody flavour is a delight to the palate. Most of our delicious "Tuber Melanosporum" black truffles grow in the Haut Var-Verdon area, home to many truffle growers, while Aups, considered as the truffle capital, proudly sports a "Maison de la Truffe" truffle centre and is the venue for a major truffle market during the harvesting season.

Saffron

Saffron is obtained by extracting and drying the pistils of the "Crocus Sativus" plant. It is produced manually and requires rigorous work and an adapted climate. In short, it is the fruit of passion and sunshine! This red gold grows naturally in the Var and in autumn, the saffron fields in Sillans-la-Cascade, Transen-Provence, Bagnols-en-Forêt and Aups are tinted with purple.

Spirulina

The seaweed of vitality and well-being! This blue micro-alga, grown in fresh water, is also part of the Var's palette of health foods. An ancient and once-forgotten product, it has now been hoisted back to its former prestigious status thanks to various campaigns promoting its many properties. "Spiruline de Fréjus" is now a trademark and intrinsic part of the Argens Valley's economic fabric.

Markets, short channels and quality

The Var is now home to 3 permanent "Marchés de Producteurs de Pays", located in Le Pradet, Toulon and Le Beausset. Three additional towns welcome farm markets in summer: Cuers, Lorgues and Les Salles-sur-Verdon.

Little fishing ports

What about the sea? The day's catch is an even shorter distribution channel! The Var is home to many small ports where you can watch the boats come in and see the fishermen setting up their still-wriggling stalls and shouting out the merits of their scorpion fish, sea bass, sea bream, porgy fish and sardines – a treat for strollers and cooks alike.

Many of the local fishing ports continue to celebrate the fishermen's patron saint on **Saint-Peter's Day in late June – early July**. In bygone days, the boats stayed at the quayside for 3 days during this celebration and it was a time when local fishermen repainted their boats, stretched out their nets... and enjoyed a game of boules! A traditional procession still crosses the local villages to the sea; a statue of the saint is placed in a decorated rowing boat and blessed with water and flowers. In the evening, an ancient wooden boat is often burnt, while traditional "pointu" fishing boats, festooned with lights for the occasion, parade along the coast.

BON APPÉTIT!

It doesn't take long to find out that understanding Provence's gastronomy isn't just about sitting down to eat. Food in Provence is a genuine experience!

Gastronomy here is part and parcel of our lifestyle. That's why we encourage visitors to tour the local landscapes, meet with producers and chat with restauranteurs to work up an (educated) appetite! Gastronomy in the Var is a whole philosophy.

Cookery classes

What better way to learn about Provence's culinary specialities than a hands-on experience?! Premium produce, endless fabulous markets and talented chefs – we have all the ingredients for a dream cookery class! Not forgetting the "Institut Gastronomie Riviera" in Seillans and restaurant La Colombe in Hyères.

You just have to make the right choices You don't need to be a star-rated chef to pull off a truffle brouillade, ratatouille, tapenade or anchoïade, or invite your friends round for a Soupe au Pistou or Aïoli. 

The success and quality of this ancient terroir relies on the work of the men and women who have nurtured our soil, built the dry stone terraces where our vines now flourish and dedicated themselves to furthering research and wine making techniques, leading to today's spectacular transformation of this traditional industry and the Var's international reputation as a wine growing hub.

Appellations

The Var prides in its high-quality wines, as witnessed by the presence of 4 AOC wines out of the 9 grown in Provence as a whole. National recognition of these various terroirs is now topped with the prestigious European AOP (Protected Designation of Origin) label. Although the "Coteaux d'Aixen-Provence" and "Côtes de Provence" appellations spread beyond our frontiers, the "Coteau Varois de Provence" and "Bandol" wines are grown solely in the Var; created in 1941, the Bandol appellation is one of France's oldest. Many terroirs also benefit from the "Vins de Pays du Var" Protected Geographical Indication.

These various distinctions pay tribute to the character of our wines, blended using our typical grape varieties. Around a dozen different types of grape go to forge the identity of the Var's wines, including the evocatively-named "Mourvèdre" – the emblematic grape of the Bandol wines –, "Bourboulenc", originating entirely from Provence, or "Tibouren", exclusive to the Var!

THE SURPRISE FACTOR

The list of craft trades still in existence is virtually endless. Some are forgotten or little-known, while others have kept resolutely up with the times. Specializing in ceramics, wood turning, "santon" figurines, photography, mosaics, visual arts, wrought iron, stringed instruments, stained-glass windows, brasswork, nativity scenes, pipes, confectionery, soaps, sandals or hats, all blur the lines between artistic creation, artisan manufacturing techniques and traditional trades.

Arts & Crafts

Arts & crafts comes in many shapes and forms in the Var - both artistic and utilitarian -, but are first and foremost committed to traditional values such as the use of local materials: our emblematic olive wood, clay used for the tiles and earthenware decorating our ancient country houses and iron used for Provence's typical bell towers...

Wood

Olive is the most coveted of all the local woods, but other varieties such as boxwood and cade also call for patience and unique know-how. The local markets offer up a magnificent array of hand-crafted wooden objects used every day in the kitchen, such as salad bowls, cutlery and pestles & mortars. The Var is home to numerous wood workshops, located in Aups, Fayence and Aiguines.

Reeds for wind instruments are one of the Var's heritage crafts, with a variety of reputed firms located in Ollioules Cogolin, Le Lavandou and Pierrefeu. A festival is even dedicated to them every year in Hyères!

Clay


The local craftsmen continue to mix, knead and whittle clay to make everyday objects such as tiles, pottery, earthenware and our traditional "santon" figurines. Some towns owe their international fame to clay: Salernes' legendary "tomette" floor tiles (little hexagonal red tiles) are still coveted by decorators and traditionally used in Provence's country houses.

The "santon" figurine is another regional speciality. Born in Marseille in the late 18th century, these little, hand-crafted, hand-painted characters have become emblems of Provence throughout the world.

"Santon" figurines are still manufactured today in respect of tradition, combining ancient know-how and closely-kept workshop secrets.

Wrought iron

Another typical example of Provencal lifestyle, wrought ironwork is very present in the Var's architecture. A story of finesse, these works of art embellish grids and balconies with scrolls and lace... The Var is still home to many master ironmongers.





Producer and artisan tours

Aimed at introducing visitors to the Var's traditional economy and know-how, these tours focus on working businesses boasting a special heritage, with producers and artisans opening the doors to their production or exhibition site and giving away some of their time-honoured secrets Several labels have now been created to promote businesses that continue to perpetuate traditional techniques anchored in our history and visitors enjoy an original and sometimes offbeat activity programme, unveiling a very authentic and still-thriving facet of the area. Opt for a backstage tour of a master pipe maker in Cogolin or venture into the "Sandale Tropézienne" workshop - these unique, all-leather sandals were first produced in 1927!

A tribute to ancient trades

Although much of our rich artisan heritage has been handed down through the generations, some, such as the ice wells of the Sainte-Baume hills that formerly supplied ice throughout the region, has now disappeared. Happily, the cork trade (cork was harvested from oaks in the Maures hills), is experiencing a rebirth today. A new adventure on the cards? Our local museums offer a precious testimonial to these ancient trades and include the "Musée des Arts et Traditions Populaires" folk museum in Draguignan and specialist-interest museums such as the "Musée des Tourneurs sur Bois" (Wood Turners' Museum) in Aiguines, "Maison de l'Olivier" (Olive Museum) in Provence Verte and private collection of Château de l'Aumérade in Pierrefeu, exhibiting no less than 1,800 "santon" figurines! Among these many charming and instructive excursion ideas, the "Maison de la Céramique Architecturale Terra Rossa" ceramics museum in Salernes remains a must.
