
On Reunion Island, the elements come together: water, earth, fire and air, inviting the traveller to take part in a unique adventure at the heart of the Indian Ocean.
















# THE WHALES JOURNEY

During the austral winter, after a long journey all the way from the Antarctic, humpback whales arrive on the coasts of Reunion Island every year, choosing the warm waters of the Indian Ocean to bring their offspring into the world. Nature lovers flock to catch a glimpse of the incredible show put on by these giants of the seas, and some of the lucky ones are even treated to an unforgettable encounter with one of these creatures, at the heart of the Indian Ocean. So that the activity of whale watching can be developed in a sustainable way and to ensure the well-being of these animals, a set of rules to respect when approaching whales was established in 2010, and modified in 2017 for the World Humpback Whale Congress that was held in Saint-Leu. The Reunion Region is currently aiming to get the "Route des Baleines" on UNESCO's World Heritage list.



# PRACTICAL INFORMATION









40% of the territory is listed as world heritage by UNESCO (the pitons, cirques and ramparts).

The Piton des Neiges is the highest point of the Indian Ocean, with a peak of 3,069m.

The Piton de la Fournaise is one of the most active volcanos in the world, with 5 eruptions in 2019.

It is possible to dive with whales during the austral winter season.











#### UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE

Since 2010, the pitons, cirques and ramparts of Reunion Island have been on the list of natural places classified as world heritage sites by UNESCO, bringing exceptional universal value to these superb places. More than 40% of the Reunion Island territory is listed as World Heritage. This jewel of the Indian Ocean has around 200 microclimates making it the ideal habitat for an incredibly diverse ecosystem: almost 3,000 native plant species have been recorded here and amongst the, 230 flora species are unique in the world!

# MAFATE: AN ECOTOURISM LABORATORY

Accessible only on foot or by helicopter, this extraor-dinarily preserved site offers a range of jaw-dropping landscapes within a UNESCO World Heritage site.

To make sure the Cirque remains a preserved environment and to ensure the protection of the local people and culture, tourism here is limited and sustainable and responsible practices are encouraged.

Clean energy is used, waste management practices are implemented, environmental pollution is limited, the biodiversity is preserved, local production and consumption are encouraged and a culture of disconnection and sharing make the Cirque of Mafate a reference in terms of ecotourism.

#### A UNIQUE TERRITORY

The highest volcano of France is in La Réunion: The Piton des Neiges, culminating at 3069 meters above the sea level and is also the rooftop of the Indian Ocean! Now dormant this volcano created La Réunion. Since largely eroded, Piton des Neiges and its surroundings offer unique mountainous relief, recognized by UNESCO.

With 5 eruptions in 2019, the Piton de La Fournaise is one of the most active volcanos in the world. Every time, locals and visitors can enjoy a breath-taking spectacle. The fountains and flows of liquid lava of this active volcano cascade down the basalt-rich slopes and sometimes even into the Indian Ocean. Before reaching the volcano, you will cross the Plaine des Sables and the landscapes that will make you feel like you've landed on planet Mars.

To fully live the volcanic experience, literally get inside La Réunion and explore the lava tunnels, created by the previous eruptions.
