ATLANTIC LOIRE VALLEY

Take a stroll around Angers, voted France's greenest city in 2020 with its 1,500 acres of parks and green spaces. Follow the nature trails on Ile St-Aubin or visit Terra Botanica, the world's first plant-themed amusement park.

The town is investing €178m to become carbon-neutral within 12 years.

AUVERGNE-RHONE-ALPES

Visit the city of Grenoble, awarded European Green Capital for 2022. France's largest low emission zone and top city for bicycle commuting, it has addressed noise pollution with dedicated quiet areas and planted over 5,550 trees since 2014. This year, it will produce the equivalent of its consumption in renewable, zero-carbon, zero-nuclear energy.

BRITTANY

Brittany's coastline, bays and archipelagos are a haven for many sea mammals and birds. Some, such as the common bottlenose dolphin, live there all year round. Head out to sea from Port-Mer with Gael from the Al-lark Association to catch sight of them from the water. Excursions last four hours and 60% of trips have successful sightings.

FRANCE'S GREEN BUCKET LIST

CORSICA

If you're up for a challenge, experience this Mediterranean island's rugged beauty by tackling its GR20 hiking route or equivalent GT20 cycle route. France boasts around 370 GR (Sentier de Grande Randonnée) hiking trails in total, alongside nine (out of 15) trans-European cycle routes.

BURGUNDY

The Morvan regional park was one of the first to be created in France and has a rich ecosystem, with three Natura 2000 sites and Natural Zones of Ecological Interest, Flora and Fauna. The Haut-Jura regional park boasts a further Natura 2000 site and is the place to spot endangered species such as the lynx and capercaillie.

NOUVELLE AQUITAINE

The French wine capital of Bordeaux has been named Capital of Smart Tourism for 2022. Look out for its eco-focused vineyards, accessible tram lines and the Darwin Ecosystem: former military barracks now home to an urban farm and France's largest organic restaurant.

NORMANDY

Take kayaks out to sea and explore the Chausey Islands, a wild archipelago 17km off the port of Granville on the Normandy coast.

The islands are home to abundant wildlife and stunning white sand beaches, cut off from the world with a castaway feel.

OCCITANIE

Cruise along the UNESCO-listed Canal du Midi, one of France's mightiest waterways running 250km from Toulouse to Sète.

Electric boats are available for hire – and taking bikes on board allows exploration of the towpaths and pretty towns en route, including Castelnaudary and Carcassonne.

PARIS REGION

The world's largest urban rooftop urban farm has opened at French capital's Expo Porte de Versailles. NU-Paris aims to produce up to 1,000kg of organic fresh produce daily from its hydroponic fruit and vegetable beds. It also boasts beehives, a greenhouse event space and a restaurant and bar.

EASTERN FRANCE

A member of Eurovélo cycle routes since 2019, the Meuse à Vélo offers over 1,000km to enjoy along the banks of this mighty river in eastern France. Ride a mixture of cycle paths and quiet roads from the city of Langres in Haute-Marne to the citadel of Givet in Ardennes, surrounded by beautiful countryside.

PROVENCE

France's first underwater museum, the Musée Subaquatique in Marseille is a series of sculptures submerged in the Anse des Catalans bay that can only be reached by diving.

The museum aims to raise public awareness of environmental issues and marine biology, its sculptures created with recycled, pH-neutral cement.

NORTHERN FRANCE

Sealife centre Nausicaa in Boulogne-sur-Mer is not only Europe's largest aquarium,but also plays a pivotal role in educating visitors on the role of the sea in our environment.

The latest immersive exhibition, entitled 'Into the Eye of the Climate', inspires with solutions we can all adopt to combat climate change.

LOIRE VALLEY

'En Roue Libre' encourages green ways of visiting the Loire Valley's colourful gems, including chateaux gardens such as Rivau, Chaumont-sur-Loire and La Javelière. There are 5,000km of cycle routes and 20,000km of hiking paths to explore the region at a slow pace, in respect of nature.





SOUTHERN FRENCH ALPS - COTE D'AZUR

ISOLA 2000 CELEBRATES 50 YEARS AT THE TOP

Ninety minutes' drive from the Côte d'Azur and the enchanting shores of the Mediterranean, Isola 2000 is one of the most famous resorts in the Southern Alps. In winter, you can ski with a view of the sea when the weather is clear – while in summer you can enjoy the green surroundings of the Mercantour National Park, the bountiful Provencal sun for pleasant hikes and picnics in the mountain pastures, or mountain bike rides accompanied by the delightful whistling of marmots and leaping ibex. A chairlift and five drag lifts at an altitude of over 2,000 metres opened to the public in 1972. In 2022, the panoramic resort celebrates its 50th anniversary, at the height of its popularity. This celebration will be marked throughout the year with events and festivities.

AUVERGNE-RHÔNE-ALPES

THE 2022 LYON BIENNIAL OF CONTEMPORARY ART: 'FRAGILITY'

The Lyon Biennial of Contemporary Art returns for its 16th year with the title 'Manifesto of Fragility'. From 14 September to 31 December 2022, this edition showcases works of art that take the pulse of their time. It is envisaged as a place of reflection, focused on artistic practices that embrace the fragility of our existence.

The Biennial takes place across various sites in Lyon and the wider urban area, including the Usines Fagor, the former Musée Guimet, the MacLyon, the Parc de la Tête D'Or, the Musée d'Histoire de Lyon - Gadagne and the Musée de Fourvière. A total of 88 contemporary artists from 39 countries are invited to address the theme of fragility with a wide variety of artistic practices.

This 16th edition is an invitation to travel through the city, with contemporary art as the gateway.

OCCITANIE

STARS IN YOUR EYES

With two of France's four International Dark Sky Reserves (IDSR), Occitanie twinkles with the light of innumerable stars! The Pic du Midi and the Cévennes National Park are two of the 19 areas recognised worldwide for the exceptional quality of their night skies. Occitanie was the first Dark Sky Reserve in Europe, and with its capital Toulouse also being the capital of aerospace, it's a paradise of astronomical proportions. Two wonderful new places will open to the public for summer 2022.


Under the sparkling dome of the new Maison Tourmalet-Pic du Midi, the Maison de la Nuit aims to raise awareness of the harmful effects of light pollution. You can also learn about nocturnal myths and experience the magic of starry skies thanks to the extraordinary scenography. At the top of Mont Aigoual in the Cévennes, a climate change interpretation centre awaits the curious on the panoramic site of the century-old Meteorological Observatory. Enlightening!



Beyond the cycling, the ViaRhôna is a great opportunity to discover and enjoy, at your own pace, the many riches of the regions passed through, and in particular the Vallée de la Gastronomie and its over 250 different offerings. Eat up the miles with relish!

A GENTLE MEANDER THROUGH THE HEART OF BRITTANY



Keen to discover the lesser-known inland Brittany - that of quaint villages, chateaux and enchanted forests? All aboard for the canals and rivers of Brittany, a 600km route of navigable waterways at the heart of the region. On the Nantes-Brest Canal, the Oust, the Blavet or the Vilaine, with family or friends, there's no need for a captain's licence. Relax and take it steady in a houseboat for a little adventure of a few days, or in a small, easily manoeuvred electric boat for a couple of hours - and take in the sights of the flower-festooned locks, without exceeding five to 10 km/h. And those who don't want to take the helm can relax. You can take a guided boat tour on the Katoune, a typical flat-bottomed boat with cabin. A relaxing way of seeing Bon-Repos Abbey and Guer-lédan Lake, the largest and most legendary in Brittany.

ECOLOGICAL UNESCO ON THE LOIRE BY BIKE




Between Sully-sur-Loire and Angers, the Loire Valley is a cultural and natural landscape that has been listed as a UNESCO Heritage Site since 2000. To enjoy it while keeping it pristine, get on your bike and set off on the Loire à Vélo, one of the most beautiful cycle routes in France. A land where history has sown fairytale chateaux, enchanting gardens and parks. Chambord, Chenonceau, Blois and Azay-le-Rideau... The beautiful stages follow one after the other effortlessly along the royal river, with foodie breaks coming in the form of charming guinguettes (open-air cafés). Logistically it couldn't be easier.

There are 670 businesses along the route displaying the 'Accueil Vélo' sign to offer their services, including bike rental, luggage transfers, accommodation or sites to visit... And don't forget, if you need a break you can hop onto the dedicated Loire à Vélo trains. So why not get away for the day and take in a circuit in the land of chateaux?

ON TWO WHEELS IN THE BALAGNE, THE GARDEN OF CORSICA

From Calvi to the Desert des Agriates, between sea and mountains, idyllic beaches and crystal waterfalls, the Balagne has around 30 picturesque villages perched up high overlooking the Mediterranean. In spring or autumn, when the sun is not too strong, we recommend you take to a road or mountain bike to explore this so-named 'Garden of Corsica' with the intoxicating scent of the maquis (scrubland). You will have to pedal and stay focused because some climbs are taxing, as are the technical descents. But there are routes and itineraries on roads and paths, labelled by the French Cycling Federation, to suit everyone, from those with well-conditioned calves to active families or groups of friends. And the reward is worth it all. Breathtaking panoramas, valleys strewn with centuries-old olive trees, and shaded village squares with welcoming terraces to enjoy refreshment stops. Welcome to the Balagne!

IN SLOW MODE IN COLLIOURE



The small port and fishing village of Collioure on the shores of the Mediterranean, and its picturesque alleys and charming colourful houses, have inspired painters from Matisse to Picasso. There are a variety of pleasures to discover in what is known as the Pearl of the Vermeille coast. For a jaw-dropping panorama, take an electric scooter to Fort Saint-Elme without needing to break a sweat. In the old town, walk in the footsteps of Matisse by following a treasure hunt. After that, why not take a walk through the terraced vineyards, bordered by dry stone walls where the wines of Collioure and the famous Banyuls wines are produced? Down by the sea, laze on the beach, paddle a kayak at sunset or dare to take the plunge with an introduction to diving in the Gulf of Lion natural marine park. Get a front row seat to admire the corals, rub shoulders with the octopi and observe the sea urchins!

The Tonnerre de Brest (Google it): what a harbour! One of the most beautiful in France. It's especially attractive when the old sailing ships gather, as will be the case in 2024. At the tip of Brittany, Brest steers a course between modernism, neoclassicism, Art Nouveau, Art Deco, and a wind of novelty blows over the Capucins plateau. To get to this district, home of the old shipbuilding workshops, simply hop aboard the cable car.

At the top, head for a unique museum of the sea and the future. Its name? 70.8, in reference to the percentage of the earth that is covered by oceans. Shaped like a gigantic ship's bow, this educational

BEAUTIFUL GLASS IN MEISENTHAL, LORRAINE

It was in Moselle, in a green valley of the Vosges Mountains, that in 1858 a glassblower had the idea of blowing glass balls from his long cane to decorate the Christmas tree. The tradition has spread throughout the country and continues to ensure the reputation of the Verrier de Meisenthal site. Today it skilfully combines heritage and contemporary creation to bring together the Glass Museum, the International Glass Art Centre and the Halle Verrière. What else is there to see there?

A new museum route spotlights outstanding collections, including Art Nouveau gems by Émile Gallé, leader of the Ecole de Nancy, as well as the history of the site and blowing techniques. A stone's throw away, a gallery exhibits the works of contemporary artists and designers and a 'moulothèque' with amazing cast iron moulds. The visit ends in the glassmakers' workshop with demonstrations... you'll be blown away!

BASTIA: A BALCONY OVER THE SEA

City of Art and History, authentic and timeless, modern and creative, Bastia does not give away too much at first glance. To capture the deep soul of the capital of Haute Corse, candidate for the title of European Capital of Culture in 2028, you have to step into the steep alleys of the old town with their Baroque oratories and majestic churches, reach the high-perched citadel, visit the Bastia museum in the old Palais des Gouverneurs and then return down to the Port and stroll around Place Saint Nicolas. And above all, without failure, take the Aldilonda, a new extraordinary promenade over the waves. Find yourself suspended between sky and sea along the gentle curves of the rocky flank between the Old Port and the Arinella beach, and take in the breathtaking views.

metres off the coast and accessible only at low tide by boat from Royan and Verdon-sur-Mer, the Cordouan Lighthouse has stood proudly at the entrance to the Gironde Estuary since 1611.

Two hours' drive from Bordeaux, this 'Versailles of the seas', with state rooms and royal chapel, deserves its place on the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. From April to November, it's with pounding hearts and wet feet that you can reach this historic monument, welcomed in person by the proprietor. At the top of the six floors, after climbing 301 steps, the breathtaking panorama opens wide to the horizon opens wide to the horizon.




